_____ **Black Gold: The Oil Experience (History/Social Studies/Science)**

Indoor and outdoor exhibition tells the story of the 1920s oil boom in south Arkansas. From the formation and discovery of oil, through the extraction, storage and transportation techniques used, our interpreters will guide you through this fascinating piece of local history and the many uses of petroleum and petroleum by-products throughout our lives. We will follow this program up with hands-on STEM activities.

_____ **Conservation of Energy: What's the Big Deal Anyway? (Social Studies/Science)**

What is energy and where does it come from? Students will learn about the different types of energy. We will compare renewable and non-renewable and the role they play in the global market. Finally, the tour will explore the different perspectives between historical treatment of the environment and today's environmental protections. We will follow this program up with hands-on STEM activities.

_____ **Boomtown St.: Oil Boom to Bust (History/Social Studies/Science)**

Our Boomtown creates a unique, immersive learning environment that includes authentic sights and sounds of a historical oil boom town. Boomtown St. reflects the small towns in south Arkansas that rose up in the 1920s, echoing the culture of an oil boom town and explores the lasting impact the discovery of oil had the local communities. We will follow this program up with hands-on STEM activities.

_____ **Tinkering Program: Intelligent Fun at the Museum**

Tinkering Programs offer hands-on STEM activities and a chance for kids to discover our local heritage and get the most out of their museum visit. Join us for a Tinkering Program, which include construction, simple machines, electrical circuits, coding, and more!!
